### 2021 ACTIVITY REPORT OVERVIEW SOS MEDITERRANEE FRANCE

SOS MEDITERRANEE IS A EUROPEAN MARITIME AND HUMANITARIAN ORGANISATION FOR THE RESCUE OF LIFE IN THE MEDITERRANEAN. IT WAS FOUNDED BY CITIZENS IN MAY 2015 IN RESPONSE TO THE DEATHS IN THE MEDITERRANEAN AND THE FAILURE OF EUROPEAN STATES TO PREVENT THESE DEATHS.

SOS MEDITERRANEE WORKS AS A EUROPEAN ASSOCIATION WITH TEAMS IN GERMANY, FRANCE, ITALY, AND SWITZERLAND IN A EUROPEAN NETWORK. TOGETHER THEY FINANCED AND OPERATED THE RESCUE SHIP AQUARIUS FROM FEBRUARY 2016 UNTIL OCTOBER 2018 AND ARE NOW FINANCING AND OPERATING THE *OCEAN VIKING*. SINCE LAUNCHING OUR OPERATION WE HAVE ASSISTED OVER 35,000 SURVIVORS ABOARD OUR RESCUE SHIPS.

### AN UNCONDITIONAL COMMITMENT TO SAVE LIVES

n 2021, the *Ocean Viking* patrolled in the Central Mediterranean to save lives most of the year.

On April 22<sup>nd</sup>, **SOS MEDITERRANEE** witnessed a tragedy. The *Ocean Viking* received a distress alert and headed towards it during the entire night, through waves up to 5 meters. Without effective coordination from the relevant authorities to support the search and the rescue of the boat in distress, our crew only found a wreck in the morning, and floating bodies around it. About 130 people lost their lives. These women, men, and children may have been rescued with European-led search and rescue capacities and with effective and transparent coordination from the European States. Since then, the frightening number of deaths kept rising in 2021: 1,553 people are known to have lost their lives in the Central Mediterranean, the highest figure since 2017. How much longer will it take for European member and associated States

to act and take responsibilities to show solidarity towards those in distress at sea?

Onshore, the launch of the Local Governments' Platform Supporting **SOS MEDITERRANEE** has also shown a concrete support from its 76 members. They have raised awareness and supported many events organised by our volunteers all around France.

Rescue at sea is unconditional, it is an absolute moral and legal duty. All the teams of **SOS MEDITERRANEE** onboard and onshore remain mobilised and can count on massive support from European citizens. Thanks to this great solidarity chain, together, we rescued 2,832 people with the *Ocean Viking* in 2021. **SOS MEDITERRANEE** continues its operations and will do so as long as necessary.

#### **RESCUE OPERATIONS**

- >2,832 people rescued
- > 35% of survivors under-18 significantly more than in 2021
- > Long standoff before being able to disembark survivors in a Place of Safety (six days in average)
- > New partnership with the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC)
- > SOS MEDITERRANEE witnesses a tragic shipwreck on April 22

31 SAR (search and rescue) operations\*





#### 33 boats rescued

(15 rubber boats, 14 small or medium wooden boats, 2 large wooden boats, and 2 small fiberglass boats)

The Ocean Viking rescued two boats simultaneously on January 22<sup>nd</sup>, then on April 27<sup>th</sup>, which explains a total of 31 SAR operations and 33 boats rescued.

# SAVE, PROTECT, TESTIFY

### CONTEXT AT SEA

- >50 % more deaths in Central Mediterranean compared to 2020
- Increase of interceptions by Libyan coastguards, supported by the E.U.
- Continuous lack of Search and Rescue
  (SAR) coordination by maritime authorities
- >Gradual return of humanitarian rescue ships



Since September 2021, the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) joined SOS MEDITERRANEE onboard the *Ocean Viking* in order to help provide post-rescue support, including first aid, medical care, psychological support, food, dry clothes, blankets, toiletries and information to the people who have been safely brought on board the *Ocean Viking*. From January to December, **3,524 medical consultations took place on the deck** and **in the medical clinic**. Each mission includes at least a midwife, a nurse, and a doctor from either SOS MEDITERRANEE, or IFRC. (Picture: Filippo from SOS MEDITERRANEE and Katrin from IFRC in the middle of a training).




### 2021 FINANCIAL REPORT
